

Unique Features

- **Blended classes** throughout K-8 enable children to move up or down the curriculum levels according to each child's ability.
- **Daily peer interaction:**
 - **Academics**—Students of various ages work together. This encourages each to stretch and grow, developing qualities of cooperation and respect. One-on-one peer tutoring is a prominent feature throughout the day.
 - **Athletics**— Students work together to practice the basic physical skills. Their daily games encourage all to meet their athletic potential and develop sportsman qualities.
- **Daily Communication:** Because of the proximity of families to school, parents bring their children each day...therefore, parents and teachers have an opportunity for daily communication.
- **Parent-Teacher-Student Conferences** have 100% participation, with over 50% of the conferences having both parents in attendance.
- **Computerized Library Catalog** with a web resource connection. Library is expanded and has titles for the entire family.
- **Foreign Languages** are taught weekly.
- **Transportation**—Because of our location, rural families can transport students to school as an alternative to busing.

Alumni

- 98% of the eighth graders have graduated from a 4 year high school and 2% have completed their GED.
- 62% are currently attending or have graduated from a 4 year college or university.
- 13% have graduated from a community college or joined the military.
- Currently alumni are pursuing Ph.D. 's in biochemistry, chemistry, nuclear physics, and marine biology.

History

- Lourdes School is located in the foothills of the Cascade Mountains, approximately 25 miles southeast of Salem, Oregon.
- The community in which it lies is primarily a logging and agricultural area.
- The community supports the school by donating time, skills, and talents to make the school program successful.
- Average enrollment is 40-50 students housed in a four room school.
- Assessment scores have consistently been above the state average.

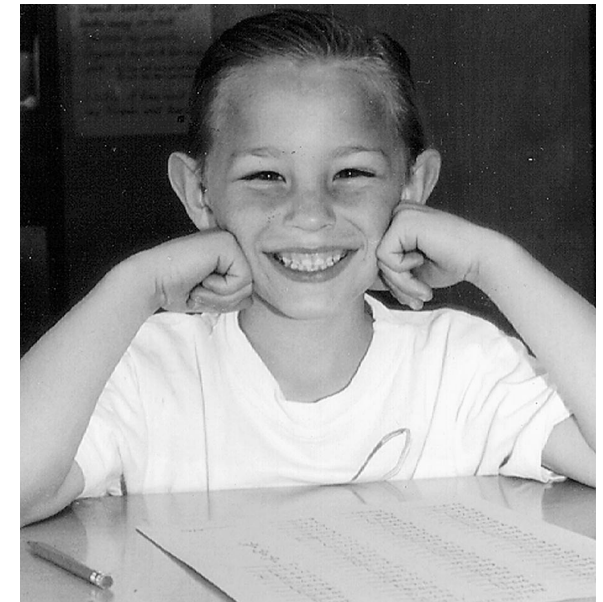

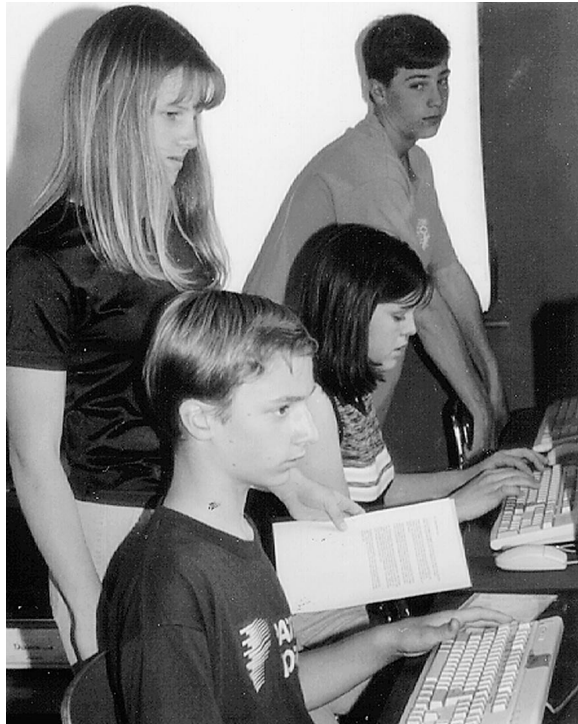
